

# SCHOOL YEAR 2007-2008

Through the years, Senden Home was able to provide not only basic needs and temporary shelter to its clients, but also educational assistance. Way back the 70's, hundreds of beneficiaries were able to finish their schooling and landed good jobs.

The school year opened in June 2007 and surely ends in March 2008. Senden Home is able to enroll a total of **100 students** in different schools. And is looking forward to see our present students receive their diplomas during their graduation.

In the reception and temporary shelter in Sta. Ana, Manila, there are 12 boys residing in the center. Eleven are going to schools nearby while the youngest in the group is a home learner in the center, under the tutorial of the educator and training of the houseparents.

New admittances for this month are 3 boys namely **Angelo Veloso**, **Benjie Loria**, and **Benjamin Loria**.

Among those who used to be in the residential program were reunited with their families but Senden Home continues to provide them with educational assistance thru the Family Outreach Program. They are Jade Matthew Canlas, Rannel Ablazo, Vincent dela Rosa, Genario Sugue Jr., Jay-Ar Rivera and Arnold Joel Antonio.

In the residential care and training center (RCTC), Binangonan, Rizal, there are 19 boys enrolled

The Family Outreach Program now offers services and assistance to 29 elementary students; 27 high schools; 6 post high schools; 6 college levels; and 1 enrolling for 2nd semesterpost high school. Total number of clients is 69 while total number of families is 56.

Beneficiaries of Senden Home vary on the number of incoming and outgoing cases. Hopefully more poor students benefit Senden Home's program & services.

Ernesto is top 3 in his class. 30% of the boys get satisfactory grades not higher than 75 to 79 while 20% failed in some of their subjects. As told by their teachers, some of our boys are very smart however they needed improvement in some areas.

In high school, only Jayson received very satisfactory ratings from 80 to 87. He is no. 8 in the top 10 of his class. The others however need to exert more effort to do better.

Two F.O. students are taking Education. Jay-Ar Rivera and Jim Oliver Oliveros are now 4th year college and finishing their practicum.


Angelica Gumabon, a Grade 5 student championed in chess in her school. She will be competing in Laguna Inter-Competition.
